CENTENARY CELEBRATION

20th June 2020 Cleve lodge, Long Eaton, Province of Derbyshire



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In The Beginning

Fairfield Lodge No.2224 was Consecrated on Thursday 10th November 1887 at 2.30pm at The Pavilion, Station Road, Long Eaton.

At a meeting in 1913 and following lengthy discussions, it was agreed that a Royal Arch Chapter should be formed in Long Eaton, Derbyshire. On Thursday, 27th May 1920, Fairfield Royal Arch Chapter No.2224 was duly Consecrated.

It was agreed that both E.Comp Dr.F.W.Bloomer and E.Comp W.T.Goldsworth would visit the 3rd Provincial Grand Principal, E Comp N | Hughes - Hallett, who at the time was acting as the ME Grand Superintendent in Charge with an invitation for him to become the Primus MEZ of the new Fairfield Chapter, he being the oldest Past Master and a founder member of the Fairfield Lodge No.2224. Permission was sought to name it the "Hughes-Hallett Chapter." This was consented to but unfortunately with the break-out of the First World War nothing could proceed.

On the 8th August 1919 with peace restored, another meeting was held to obtain the consent of Fairfield Lodge members for the proposed Chapter to be attached to that Lodge, and this was subsequently agreed.

In 1914, due to a ruling by Supreme Grand Chapter that no Royal Arch Chapter should be named after any living person, a change of name was required, hence the name "Fairfield Chapter" was adopted instead.

The Consecration ceremony took place at the Masonic rooms, Station Road, Long Eaton and the ceremony was conducted by the Consecrating Officer E Comp P. Colville Smith G.S.E.

In 1945 the meetings of the Chapter moved to The Queens Hotel, Long Eaton although Installations were held at the Provincial headquarters in Gower Street, Derby. The first meeting of the Chapter held at Cleve Lodge was in November 1954, with a regular convocation. According to the records in the Janitor's Register, there were 29 members 10 guests plus one candidate present.

When the fire at the Grange at Littleover occurred in 1990, many records were lost and no copies of the Consecration summons survived. Fortunately, other records such as minute books, signatures in registers and accounts records were kept in archive boxes at Cleve Lodge and have survived to this day. The original members' record book is still used today by the present Scribe E and will probably last for a thousand years judging by the portion used to date.

All members names since 1920 are listed at the end of this booklet together with their status i.e. resigned, died when still a member, or excluded. If no remark is recorded they are still a member at the time of print, along with the year they occupied the Chair of 1st Principal in the Chapter.

(Extracts from the Booklet "How They Did Build" by H. W. Hassall appear below)

The Chapter has met every year since 1920 without a break, even through the Second World War. Exaltation ceremonies took place every year until the latter years of 2012, 2018 & 2019 when no candidates were available causing concern for the chapter's continuing viability. In 1920 there were six Exaltations with four the next year, three in 1922 and five in 1923, how things have changed! Throughout the Second World War there were generally three Exaltations per year and this trend continued until the last few years.

The first Exaltee to be listed in the members, register on the 16th September 1920 was Comp John Marshall age 74 and hailing from Fairfield Lodge No 2224, who is recorded as being a retired "Malster" although it is suspected that this is an error and should read Maltster He was raised on the 25th of February 1888. John was a member until the 8th January 1931 when he sadly died. Early Exaltees ranged from lace manufacturers, architects, bank managers, sanitary inspectors, cashiers, solicitors and a butcher.


The bye laws were altered in the period 1930-31 after several dispensations to hold the Chapter Convocations on the third Tuesday in the month (previously the meetings were held on the third Thursday.) In September 1933, a dispensation was given to re-elect a companion to serve as the Third Principal of the Chapter as it became apparent that the companion elected at the March meeting was considered unsuitable!

The Chapter's first home for 24 years was The Pavilion, Station Road, Long Eaton and the members were all very happy together there. It was a roomy, comfortable Temple with a spacious dining room downstairs in which seven-course meals were served. The Chapter had eight Stewards. One of their duties was to collect ale from the public bar in 2 gallon enamel jugs and serve it to the companions! The main dish of a long menu was suckling pig which was carried in and carved by the Past Principals of the Chapter, the actual carver was attired in a chef's white coat and hat.

It was served from a long table at one end of the room in full view of all the diners. The Fairfield Chapter's favourite main course consisted of sheep's hearts. The punch bowl and snuff box were handed round after regular meetings.

Over the years Fairfield Chapter has been blessed with many noteworthy companions and we are fortunate that we have been able to write a tribute about one of them below:

Fairfield Chapter Charter



Ernest Stevens – the Man and the Mason written by E Comp Ben Turner

Anyone who has visited Long Eaton's Masonic Hall could hardly have missed the glowing tribute to Ernest Stevens on the plaque above the shelf where the attendance book is positioned for brethren to sign. He was undoubtedly one of Long Eaton's leading freemasons during the second half of the twentieth century, and I was lucky enough to know the man as well as the Mason. He was a close friend of my parents and lived directly opposite my family home in Derby Road, Risley, until my parents moved house in 1972.

Ernest's Masonic career is well documented. In the Craft, he was initiated into the Harrington Lodge on May 13th 1949 and became Worshipful Master in 1963. Provincial appointments and promotions followed culminating in his advancement to the rank of Provincial Senior Grand Warden in 1993. He was exalted into Fairfield Chapter in 1953, became First Principal in 1968 and was a founder member of the Harrington Chapter which was formed in 1988. He was a member of Trivona Mark Lodge, taking the Chair in 1965, and a member of both Stanton Vale and Fairfield Rose Croix Chapters, attaining the rank of 31st degree in the order. Plenty of committed and enthusiastic Masons have down the years achieved similar levels of distinction, but what sets Ernest apart was that he was a builder, and in the 1940's and 1950's Long Eaton's Masons needed just such a man.

Fairfield Lodge was formed in 1876 and along with Harrington Lodge which was formed in 1929, and the various other orders, met at the Pavilion Hotel in Station Road until 1945. The expiry of the lease there meant that a new Masonic home was needed, and the Lodges and Chapters moved to the Queen's Hotel, where the accommodation was basic and rather cramped. An enterprising group of freemasons immediately began fund-saving for a new building, but there could hardly have been a less propitious time to start such a project, as wartime bombing had destroyed or damaged over two million homes in the U.K. A massive house-building programme took precedence over less urgent projects like new Masonic halls and it was not until 1952 that Cleve Lodge was purchased.

Ernest Stevens came from a family of builders and his father E.E.Stevens established his building firm in Long Eaton in 1906. Ernest was born in 1911 and at the beginning of World War 2 he was living in Derby Road, close to Trent College. In 1940 he married Augustine Thompson and the couple moved to Risley, where my own parents' house had been completed a year earlier. In 1943 Ernest was commissioned into the Royal Engineers as a Second Lieutenant, and experienced varied war service, emerging at the end of hostilities with the rank of Major. In 1954 Ernest tendered for the contract to extend Cleve Lodge, and provide a temple and dining facilities, and his tender was accepted. It is easy to imagine that after his many war experiences with the Royal Engineers, he would view the task of adding a contemporary extension to a Victorian House, thereby doubling the size of the premises, as an enjoyable challenge rather than a headache. He had an outgoing, friendly personality and plenty of confidence. He and his wife 'Teenie' played lots of bridge and some golf with my parents and Ernest was by all accounts a formidable bridge player with a retentive memory. A successful building business made him and his wife relatively prosperous and theirs was about the first home in the immediate neighbourhood to have a television. Ernest liked innovation and I remember him buying a Triumph Herald, a model that stood out for its contemporary styling when cars of traditional pre-war design were still being manufactured. About a year later Ernest bought one of the first Austin Minis, a model that was even more innovative than the Herald, but very small by modern standards. At over six feet tall, Ernest got into the car with some difficulty.

Around this time Ernest had set up a builders' merchants business in Long Eaton and his intimate knowledge of the building trade made this a success. In his later years he moved to a splendid bungalow in Woodhouse Eaves, in Leicestershire's Charnwood Forest, but he continued to be a regular attendee to the various Lodges and Chapters of which he was a member at Cleve Lodge. At every meeting, I'm sure he looked at his surroundings and felt a quiet sense of satisfaction from a job well done. Ernest passed away aged 86 in 1997.

First Entry in the Minutes Book -Report of the Consecration of the Fairfield Royal Arch Chapter No.2224

The Consecration of the Fairfield R A Chapter No.2224 took place on Thursday the 27th May 1920 at the Masonic Rooms Station Road Long Eaton.

The Founders of the Chapter and a number of Companions assembled and took their places at 3.0'clock

The Consecration Principal Ex Comp P. Colville Smith G.S.E. England with Ex Comp Joseph Cook P.G.Std.B.Eng. as H and Ex Comp Rev W.P Besley P.G.S.H.Eng. as J. Ex Comp A D Habsall P.A.G.Soj.Eng as N. E Comp A Ransford-Collett D.G.DofC.Eng. as D of C entered at 3.05 accompanied by the First Principal designate Ex Comp N.J.Hughes-Hallett P.G.Std.B.Eng. and Ex Comp W.S.Gilman P.G.Std.B.Eng.

The Consecrating Principals opened a Royal Arch Chapter after which the Hymn "Hail Eternal by whose aid" was sung, Ex Comp J.E.Collins P.P.G.Orgst. Derby presided at the organ.

The Consecrating Principals then addressed the Companions on the motive of the meeting and called on the Principal J to offer Prayers.

The Director of Ceremonies addressed the Consecrating Principals as to the wishes of the Companions after which the Consecrating Principal gave directions for the Founders to be placed in the West.

The Founders of the Chapter having been arranged in order. The D of C read the Charter. The Founders in reply to the Consecrating Principal gave their approval in Masonic Form to the Officers named in the Charter. The Founders then resumed their seats.

An Oration on the Nature and Purpose of the Institution was then given by the Third Principal. Following which the Anthem from the 133rd Psalm was sung, and the Third Principal then gave the first portion of the Dedication Prayer.

The Companions having turned towards the East, the Consecrating Principal gave "The Invocation", and Scribe N read Ezra Chapter Three, 8th to 13th verses. The Candles were lighted and the Pedestal unveiled. The Consecration of the Chapter was Solemnly carried out according to Ancient Custom by the Consecrating Principal who with H and J proceeded three times round the Altar sprinkling in succession the Corn, the Wine and the Oil. During each perambulation Scribe N respectively read Psalm 72 verse 16. The 39th verse of the 10th Chapter of Nehemiah, and the 25th & 26th verses of the 30th Chapter of Exodus.

Before each circuit the Companions sang respectively "When once of Old in Israel" - "When there a Shrine to him alone" and "We have come Fraternal Bands"

After each perambulation the Principals halted in the East The Founders were then arranged round the Altar facing outwards and Scribe N read the 13th verse of the 2nd Chapter of Leviticus.

The Companions then sang "Now o'er our Work this Salt we Shower" The Consecrating Principal then proceeded alone round the Altar scattering Salt as a symbol of Friendship & Fidelity.

The Consecrating Principal then solemnly dedicated the Chapter and Founders resumed their seats.

The Anthem "O how amiable are thy dwellings Thou Lord of Hosts" was sung after which the Third Principal proceeded three times round the Chapter with the Censer.

The Third Principal then gave the second portion of the Dedication Prayer.

The Founders were again arranged in the West facing the East, and the Consecrating Principal Constituted the Chapter in accordance with the Terms of the Charter to be denominated the Fairfield Chapter, to be attached to the Fairfield Lodge No.2224.

The Anthem "I have surely built thee an house to dwell in" was then sung and the "Patriarchal Benediction" having been pronounced the ceremony of Consecration came to a close.

The Three Principals Designate were formally Inducted. Being already Past First Principals, Ex Comps Colville Smith, Joseph Cook and Rev W. P. Besley congratulated them on the choice the Founders had made and placed them in their respective chairs.

The Consecrating Principals then presented the Founders with their Jewels, having done so the Most Ex Z presented Ex Comp P.Colville Smith with a Jewel as Consecrating Principal.

The Most Ex Z proposed and Ex H seconded that the Consecrating Officers namely Ex Comp P.Colville Smith, Joseph Cook, Rev W.P.Besley, A.D.Hansall and A.Ramsford-Collett be made Honorary Members of the Chapter, carried unanimously.

The Most Ex Comps thanked the Chapter for the honour conferred. On Rising for the First time the Ex Z received Hearty Greetings from Grand Chapter








Copy of the Signatures of the First Convocation Meeting on 16th September 1920

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
Copy of the Consecration Accounts (by the dates written two months after the event)




